

# FFM Training

All agents and brokers must complete the federal marketplace registration and training in order to assist consumers with enrollment through Healthcare.gov beginning on November 1. NAHU members are encouraged to become certified through NAHU's federal marketplace agent and broker training program, the only program operated by an agent/broker association. Offered through NAHU's Online Learning Institute, our course includes webinar modules, a final exam, the ability to access our live help desk by phone or email to receive real-time assistance with technical questions, and the opportunity to earn continuing education credits issued on a state-by-state basis. Additionally, NAHU members can renew their certification for the low price of \$57.99 (even those who completed training and certification on any platform last year—including through CMS directly).
